

## California Prop 65

What it means to you and your customers.

## What:

Bisphenol S (BPS) was added to the list of chemicals under California's Proposition 65 (Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Environment Act of 1986) on December 29, 2023. BPS is used in thermal papers to facilitate an image as the paper is traveling through the printers' printhead. BPS was substituted for BPA several years ago when BPA was added to this same list in 2015. Today, all of TST IMPRESO manufactured thermal paper products are BPA Free, with the exception of our West Coast operation. Most thermal paper items manufactured in our Fontana, CA plant are currently BPA <u>and</u> BPS Free.

## When:

Beginning December 29, 2024, all thermal paper using BPS must include a Prop 65 warning label on the outside of each box or retail packaging. In the State of California, currently the majority of TST made items already complies with Prop 65, however any that would require a warning label, a label will be applied to the box.

## Where:

All shipments of thermal paper containing BPS to the state of California or within the state of California.

Please accept this notice as confirmation that TST IMPRESO will be in full compliance with the above, and Prop 65 labeling, where needed, will be applied to each appropriate product shipping to or within the State of California.
